

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAMS

The regular curriculum of the Holmdel Township Board of Education is designed to accomplish the district's educational goals and objectives for a thorough and efficient system of education for all pupils.

When helpful for students' educational development, the regular program shall be altered or supplemented to provide for the identified needs of the following pupils:

- A. The educationally disabled;
- B. The gifted and talented;
- C. Those requiring compensatory or remedial programs;
- D. The disaffected and alienated;
- E. Pregnant pupils;
- F. Pupils requiring home instruction;
- G. The physically disabled or those pupils eligible for Rehab 504;
- H. Those with limited English proficiency; and
- I. The disruptive.
